MARCH 23 CENTEX UPDATE ON THE HILLS OF RIVERMIST

San Antonio, Texas – March 23, 2010 – Centex will not participate in a meeting hosted by Councilman W. Reed Williams and the City of Antonio’s Planning and Development Services today, March 23 with representatives from Alliance for Homebuyer Justice, which is an organization formed by the Laborers International Union of North America (LiUNA), and Home Owners for Better Building.

“Centex has nothing but respect for Councilman Williams and the City of San Antonio’s Planning and Development Services. We have made a long-term commitment to the City and remain diligent in resolving the issue caused by the slope failure at the Rivermist community,” said Laurin Darnell of Centex Homes.

“Some of the participants in today’s meeting, however, are groups who do not have the best interest of the residents of the Rivermist community. The Alliance for Homebuyer Justice and Home Owners for Better Building are not focused on a solution or in creating a better community,” added Darnell. “It is in the community’s best interest to build the appropriate solution as quickly and safely as possible, and we feel distractions caused by supposed homeowner advocates only serve the interest of those groups—not the communities of Rivermist.”

“Our focus is on communicating with the City and the residents of the Rivermist community. As always, we remain committed to working individually with homeowners, as well as communicating with our residents and the respective homeowner associations’ board of directors about the progress we are making to execute the solution,” added Darnell.

Centex will host a meeting with the Homeowners Associations of the Rivermist Communities in April, and continues to meet with individual homeowners to discuss their issues and concerns.
